LMHA BOARD MEETING PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD



GUIDANCE FROM LMHA

“Persons wishing to address the Board of Commissioners in its regular meetings shall sign in with Clerk of the Board no less than ten (10) minutes prior to the beginning of the meeting at which they wish to speak.

Upon signing in, persons wishing to address the Board will provide the Clerk with their names, addresses, and the topic(s) on which they wish to speak. A maximum of eight (8) persons will be allowed to address the Board at each meeting. Priority will go to persons wishing to speak on items on the Board’s meeting agenda.

A maximum of three persons may address the Board with the same position on any one topic before the Board at any meeting

i.e., six (6) persons can speak on one topic before the Board at a particular meeting, three (3) in support and three (3) in opposition.

Each speaker shall be allowed a maximum of three (3) minutes to address the Board in any particular meeting.

Persons with medically recognized disabilities who are entitled to a reasonable accommodation under the Americans with Disabilities Act will be granted one (1) additional minute to speak.

Persons addressing the Board may not engage in electioneering or the endorsement or promotion of any commercial product or service.”
